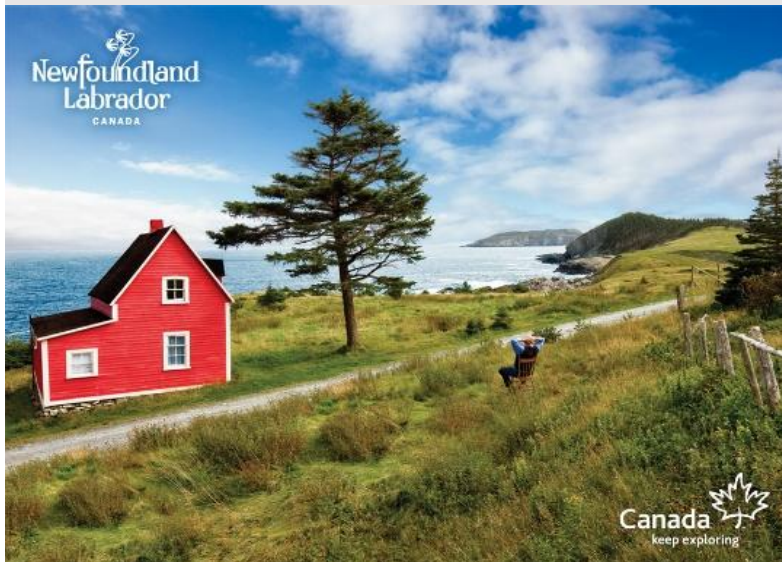

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**Day One – Monday, June 21:****Deer Lake - Rocky Harbor**

Today we will arrive in **Deer Lake, Newfoundland** – our arrival is late in the day, and we will have had dinner on our own enroute flying to Newfoundland. We will check into our hotel for **three nights** and get ready for our holiday to begin tomorrow.

**Day Two – Tuesday, June 22:****Gros Morne****(B, D)**

This morning, we will travel to **Rocky Harbor** and onto **Norris Point**, where we will take a cruise out on beautiful **Bonne Bay** with unique views of Gros Morne mountain and the Tablelands. Then it's on to **Gros Morne National Park**. Gros Morne was declared a World heritage Site in 1987 and offers some of Newfoundland's most spectacular scenery. Contributing to this unique designation are the area's significant geological features, the arctic-alpine habitat of the Long Range Mountains, the outstanding scenic beauty and the region's 5000-year-old human history. It is this area that earned Gros Morne National Park its **UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE TABLELANDS** status and its nickname as the 'Galapagos of Plate Tectonics'. The only place on the planet where the earth's mantle has broken through the earth's surface to form this unique mountain top. Dinner is included today.

**Day Three – Wednesday, June 23:****Rocky Harbor****(B, D, Kitchen Party)**

Today we will enjoy Rocky Harbor and regular views of the surrounding mountains and the beautiful bays as we discover what life is really like. We will experience the lives of the fishing families at **Broom Point Fishing Premises**. We will see the **Jennix House and Look Out** giving us one of the finest photographic spots in Western Newfoundland. **Urve Manuel's Glass Station** is a very unique stop with a full gallery and shopping. Even its location sparks inspiration with the crystal-clear light bouncing around the studio bringing the glass art to life. Tonight we will experience a traditional **Kitchen Party** before settling in for our final night in Western Newfoundland.

**Day Four – Thursday, June 24:****Rocky Harbor to Gander****(B, D)**

After breakfast, we check out of our hotel and depart Rocky Harbor for Gander. We will want to have our cameras at the ready as our time in **Gros Morne National Park** draws to a close. Later travel through central Newfoundland and on to **Gander**, where we spend **two nights**. Gander is nestled in the heart of Newfoundland and the site of Gander International Airport, once an important refueling stop for transatlantic aircraft, and still a preferred emergency landing point for aircraft facing on-board medical or security issues. During our time in Gander we will find out the inspiration for the book - *The Day the World Came to Town*, which was the inspiration for the hit Broadway Musical – *Come From Away* - following the 9/11 tragedy. Enjoy a visit to the **North Atlantic Aviation Museum** to see how aviation has played a crucial role in the development of Gander. Dinner is included.

**Day Five – Friday, June 25:****Gander****(B, D)**

A scenic drive along the rocky coast of Notre Dame Bay leads to the beautiful outport of **Twillingate**. Twillingate embodies everything so many Newfoundland and Labrador outports (a community where the sea was their only "road") are famous for: stunning coastline, historical, picturesque streets, culturally-rich entertainment and peaceful country roads. We will visit the **Long Point Lighthouse** then we are off to the **Prime Berth Fishing & Heritage Centre**, comprised of hundred-year-old fish stores, stages and flakes. Touch a 15-meter Sei whale skeleton and view life from under the sea with the live underwater camera. Return to your hotel for your final night in Gander. Dinner is included.

**Day Six – Saturday, June 26:****Gander to St. John's****(B, D)**

Head out on the Trans-Canada Highway to visit **Terra Nova National Park**, the most easterly of Canada's beautiful national parks. Abundant natural resources, such as fish and sea mammals, have attracted people to the Terra Nova area for at least 5,000 years. A good route for wildlife viewing. Travel to **Conception Bay** and marvel at the rugged coastline and deep clear water that is so attractive to many types of whales. Visit **Heart's Content Cable Station Provincial Historic Site** where the first successful transatlantic cable was received in 1866. Also visit **Harbour Grace**, where Amelia Earhart began her solo flight across the Atlantic in 1932. Continue your journey to Cupid's Cove where you will stop at **The Plantation**: home to Canada's first English settlers. Travel to St. John's where you will be staying the next **three nights**.

**Day Seven – Sunday, June 27:****St. John's****(B, D)**

This morning, we will tour historic **St. John's**. This remarkable city is unique in Newfoundland as it boasts outstanding museums, hotels, colorful architecture and fabulous dining. This day includes a visit to **Cabot Tower at Signal Hill National Historic Site**, where we can view the famous "Narrows" and admire the architecture of old St. John's. We will also visit **Cape Spear National Historic Site**, the most easterly point of land in North America. While in town we will visit the incredible "**Rooms**" **Museum** depicting Newfoundland's cultural heritage in one of the most unique museums in the world. Dinner is included tonight.

**Day Eight – Monday, June 28:****Witless Bay****(B, D)**

Today we will get a first-hand look at Maritime history and culture as we travel to Bay Bulls and take a cruise out to the icebergs and sea bird life at **Witless Bay Ecological Reserve**. We will be astounded by the sea bird activity including more than **260,000 pairs of Atlantic Puffins** - that's right thousand! In addition, we will see Murres, kittewakes, hawks, ospreys and many other shore birds along with the icebergs that are very popular this time of year - all from the safety and nearness of our sightseeing boat. Witless Bay is also home to many **Humpback, Minke, and Fin whales** in the summer months so whale sightings are a definite possibility. We will return to St. John's for our final night with a special dinner. Once back in St. John's we will visit the incredible **Johnson GEO-Center** a geological museum. The architecture suggests it is an iceberg and like an iceberg everything is beneath the surface. Here we will learn the place of Newfoundland in the geologic history of the planet. Tonight, we will enjoy a special Farewell dinner.

**Day Nine – Tuesday, June 29:****Departure****(B)**

All good things must come to an end and so we bid a fond farewell to Canada's newest yet oldest province. As you fly home, it will be with many delightful memories of an authentic Newfoundland experience that will be recalled for years to come.
